ENTRIES

Entry forms (on page 12) should reach the Show Organiser or be deposited at Frensham Village Shop no later than 12 noon on Thursday, 5th April 2018.

All exhibits must be staged between 9.15am and 10.45am on the morning of the Show, and before leaving exhibitors should check with the Stewards that their exhibits and entry slips are correctly placed in the appropriate Class. Please note the above times are slightly later than previous years.

The Show is open to the public between 2.30pm and 4.00pm after which exhibits are to be collected.

NOTES FOR EXHIBITORS

All exhibits in the Floral Arrangements, (except class 2), Flowers, Shrubs and Vegetables sections must have been grown in the exhibitor's garden or allotment and be entered in his/her name.

Exhibitors must supply their own vases, dishes and other containers.

No exhibitor may enter more than one exhibit in any one Class.

Junior classes are restricted to those aged 15 and under. To assist the Judges write the age of the child on the reverse of the entry slip and display next to their entry.

Open classes - exhibitors need not be members of the Society.

Exhibitors may include the name and variety of the flowers, plants, fruit and vegetables that they exhibit. This is purely for the interest of other exhibitors and visitors and no points will be earned or deducted whether or not this is done.

FLORAL ARRANGEMENTS

Note: an arrangement consists of flowers and/or foliage only (i.e. no accessories) unless otherwise expressly stated.

Class

1. A Splash of Sunshine. Not to exceed 60cm in width and 80cm in height.
2. A bridesmaid's hand tied posy. Not to exceed 30cm diameter. Accessories allowed. This class can include bought flowers and foliage.
3. An arrangement of garden foliage. Not to exceed 60cm in width and 80cm in height.
4. **Open class** - A vase of garden flowers. (One or more varieties).
5. **Open class - Juniors** - A Pot of Gold. Not to exceed 40cm in width and height.

FLOWERS, SHRUBS AND POTTED PLANTS

Note: We now follow the RHS guidelines for our daffodil divisions. The divisions are described on pages 8 and 9 of this booklet. Descriptions with photographs and examples can be found at <https://www.rhs.org.uk/advice/profile?PID=365>. Daffodils should be exhibited without leaves. Cut flowers and shrubs should be displayed in a vase, bowl, bottle or similar container, unless otherwise specifically stated.

Class

6. Daffodil (Division 1) - 1 stem.
7. Daffodil (Division 2) - 1 stem.
8. Daffodil (Division 3) - 1 stem.
9. Daffodil (Division 4) - 1 stem.
10. Daffodil (Division 6) - 1 stem.
11. Daffodil (Division 9) - 1 stem.
12. Daffodil with multi headed blooms (Division 5,7,8) - 1 stem.
13. Daffodils (Division 1) - 3 stems.
14. Daffodils (Division 2) - 3 stems.
15. Daffodils (Division 3) - 3 stems.
16. Daffodils one or more varieties - 10 stems.
17. Daffodils (any variety not in Divisions 1 - 5) - 3 stems.

FLOWERS, SHRUBS AND POTTED PLANTS (cont)

Class

18. Tulips, one or more varieties – 3 stems.
19. Spring flowers (no shrubs), one or more varieties – 5 stems
20. Polyanthus and Primula - 3 stems.
21. Wallflowers – 3 stems.
22. Pansies or Violas, one or more varieties - 6 heads, displayed on moss.
23. Miniature flowers (not daffodils), cut from bulbs or corms, one or more varieties – 5 stems.
24. Heather, one or more varieties – 3 stems.
25. Any flower or shrub other than a daffodil – 1 stem, spike or bloom.
26. Flowering shrubs and/or trees, 3 different varieties - 1 stem of each, maximum 100cm in width, must be in bloom.
27. Flowering shrub or tree, one variety – 3 stems, maximum 100cm in width, must be in bloom.
28. Camellia - 1 stem.
29. Camellia - 1 flower head, displayed on moss.
30. Foliage (no flowers), 4 different varieties - 1 stem of each.
31. Foliage or flowering pot plant, pot not to exceed 30cm in diameter.
32. Cactus or Succulent pot plant, pot not to exceed 20cm in diameter.
33. Potted plant(s), flowering or foliage, grown from bulb or corm within last 12 months, pot not to exceed 30cm in diameter.
34. **Open class - Juniors** - A potted plant(s), flowering or foliage. Pot not to exceed 30cm in diameter.

VEGETABLES

Class

35. Rhubarb - 3 sticks, leaves cut down to 8cm.
36. Exhibit of fresh vegetables – one or more kinds.
37. Exhibit of stored vegetables – one or more kinds.
38. Culinary herbs - 3 named varieties (no flowers), a maximum of 3 stems of each herb, in a vase or similar container.

HOME INDUSTRIES – OPEN CLASSES

Note: all items must be covered, for reasons of hygiene, and there must be no logos or trade names on jars or lids.

Class

39. A jar of marmalade, (named and dated – day/month/year).
40. Malted loaf. (Following the recipe on page 16).
41. Cheese scones – three on a plate.
42. Chocolate rum truffles - six on a plate. (Following the recipe on page 17).
43. Multi pocketed garden/hobby apron, (no bib).
44. **Juniors** – A drawing/painting of your dream tree house. For ages 8 – 15.
45. **Juniors** - A drawing/painting of an animal. For ages under 8.

PHOTOGRAPHY – OPEN CLASSES

Note: prints only, unmounted, not to exceed 22cm x 26cm. Photographs can be cropped and printed at home: digital enhancement is not allowed.

46. Reflections.
47. Stripes in nature.
48. Close up of a spring flower.

judged the exhibit of highest merit in the Show.

HUITFELDT CUP

judged the best exhibit in Floral Arrangements.

FRENSHAM SPRING CUP

judged the best exhibit in Classes 6 – 17, daffodils

DIVER CUP

for the highest points total in Classes 6 – 38, flowers, shrubs,
potted plants and vegetables.

WOOD CUP

judged the best exhibit in Classes 26 and 27, shrubs.

BARNES CUP

for the highest points total in Classes 39 – 45, Home Industries.

PEATTIE CUP

judged the best exhibit in Classes 46 – 48, Photography.

DENNE CUP

for the highest points total by a Junior.

PAT MATTIN CUP

judged the winner of the Junior Class 5, Floral Arrangements
